The gently angled back and simple lines of the Scala chair would be familiar to the immigrants that made America home at the turn of the century—and so would its name, which means “stairs” in Italian. The “steps” of Scala’s slat wood back invite the eye to climb upward even as the chair’s hard maple frame and upholstered seat provide strength and comfort.

Guest chair featuring an upholstered seat and a slat wood back. The frame is hard maple, mortise-and-tenon and doweled construction, with corner blocking reinforcing legs and rails. Legs have nylon glides. The seat is 2" thick multi-density polyurethane foam wrapped in Dacron® over webbing that is stretched over a hardwood plywood frame. Catalyzed lacquer finish in all Cumberland Maple finishes. Also available in an armless version.
