Other Thick & Thin products can be used to complete a space with a consistent aesthetic; freestanding tables, ottomans, and benches are especially flexible additions. Thick & Thin configurable walls and seating are not interchangeable with and do not connect to Plug-In components.

Thick & Thin Collection Plug-In

Making spaces for people to relax and recharge. Configurable American design and craftsmanship.

When Charlie Kane of XLG designed Thick & Thin for Cumberland, it very quickly became clear: The modularity and clean lines made the product a natural for lobbies. Designers quickly adopted it for large public spaces, places where people need to relax, recharge both literally and figuratively, and catch up on office work or with social networks—or catch a movie.

Responding to the need, Kane and Cumberland took a subset of the Thick & Thin vocabulary and enhanced it to directly target the need. The result is Plug-In, with wider seats and specialized fabrication that accepts a fixed-position armrest with optional outlets to provide personal boundary, space, and the power needed for tools for work and play. Seating modules with high or low backs gang in linear combinations; touchdown work surfaces support productivity or a change in posture; and easy-access outlets in both seating and surfaces make plugging in for a charge a breeze.

To complete the flexibility of the Plug-In environment, design details, and finish options remain the same as the rest of the Thick & Thin Collection. Freestanding pieces like tables, benches, and ottomans fit perfectly with Plug-In applications. To complete environments where power is not ubiquitously required, separate configurations of Thick & Thin seating and tables expand the possibilities.



Classrooms, auditoriums, and training facilities can be power deserts for technology-dependent users. Thick & Thin Plug-In seating configurations can offer both comfort and a charge, with access to energy as simple as flipping open the power door on an armrest.



Public seating areas often need to accommodate many people with entirely different agendas. The bar-height touchdown surface, at forty-one inches high, welcomes those who'd like to stand or perch; devices can be powered or recharged with readily accessible power. Around the perimeter, lounge seating has wide armrests, unique to Plug-In, that not only create space for a sense of security, but also provide power from flip-open doors. With the option of banquette-height legs, Thick & Thin is used perpendicular to Plug-In seating to make a place where families or colleagues can gather around a table to compare notes or eat a quick in-transit meal.

For further application flexibility, 41-inch-high walls can accept work surfaces, with or without power, at either 41- or 29-inch heights. And for dependable, repeatable quality and delivery, all of the products shown are standard Cumberland offerings. Thick & Thin Plug-In seating and work surfaces are complemented by Thick & Thin seating, Clover tables, and Li stools.



1 Surface-mounted power nodes route power from the floor or through brackets to power towers so charging is a simple part of touching down.



2 Attention to design includes the brackets that secure touch-down surfaces while channeling cables.



3 Power towers route power from floor monuments beneath seating modules, providing convenient access to power.



4 In-line tables can offer power, workspace, and personal boundary as an alternative to armrests.



5 Fixed-position Plug-In armrests are upholstered for comfort; their size enhances personal boundaries.



6 Armrests with power make a recharge as easy as flipping open a door.



7 The power door can be closed for uninterrupted surface, flip open for ready access.



8 Optional solid-surface tops are durable and easy to clean spots to set coffee and snacks.



9 Metal trim can be specified for added protection of bottom edges from unintended impacts.

10 Thick & Thin two-seat sofas provide banquette seating.

11 Clover cafe tables suit the function and aesthetic of a welcoming public space.

12 Li stools provide flexible seating for quick touch-downs.

This bird's-eye view of the application shown at left makes clear how standard Cumberland products can meet a variety of user needs. In-line tables and, unique to Plug-In, armrests, with and without power, can be placed to define space for individuals or for groups; surfaces have similar power options. Tables, work surfaces, and armrests offer users choices to accommodate a charging cell phone, a tablet, a laptop computer, or other incidentals.
